NOTICE OF AIRPORT BOARD MEETING

Tentative Agenda for the September 18, 2013 Board Meeting

<u>The Airport Board meeting will be held at Felts Field beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Airfield Maintenance Facility, Building 52</u>, located at 6105 East Rutter Avenue, Spokane, Washington 99212, on <u>Wednesday, September 18, 2013</u>. Consent Agenda (Items #1 - #24)

1. *Approval of Vouchers

Construction Warrant Numbers003888 - 003912\$2,442,877.69Operational Warrant Numbers121266 - 121834\$4,142,820.52

- *Lease Agreement for Building 1378, Suite 116 Wm. Winkler Company Lessee is utilizing ABP Building 1378, Suite 116, consisting of approximately 161 square feet as an on-site project management office. Effective July 15, 2013, the rent is approximately \$15.32 per square foot per annum or \$2,466.52 annually. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- 3. *First Amendment to Snow Removal Services Contract Haase Landscape, Inc. This ABP amendment exercises the first of four options with Haase Landscape to provide snow removal services at the Airport Business Park parking lots and sidewalks at Buildings 700, 1100 and 1200. The term commences November 1, 2013 and expires on April 1, 2014. The fee for services shall remain unchanged from the previous contract term and will be billed on an hourly rate based on type of equipment utilized. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.

- *Eighteenth Amendment to Lease Agreement County of Spokane, Geiger Corrections Center ABP The agreement with the County of Spokane Geiger Corrections expired August 31, 2013. The County has requested a three-month extension commencing September 1, 2013. All other terms and conditions of the agreement remain the same. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- 5. ***Commercial Aviation Land Lease and Operating Agreement** *Associated Painters, Inc.* SIA Associated Painters has requested a land lease agreement for 70,931 square feet of unimproved land and 68,316 square feet of adjacent ramp. The term of the agreement shall be 30 years with a twenty-year option commencing the first of the month following the start of construction or October 1, 2013, whichever occurs first. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- *Crop Farm Agreement *Jeffrey and Paula Oswald* The current farm lease with the Oswalds sIA expired on August 31, 2013. The Oswalds will discontinue the farming of property located adjacent to the runway protection zone for Runway 3 but will continue to farm 107 acres west of Hayford Road. They will make an annual payment of \$1,123.50. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- *Consent to Assignment of Hangar and Ramp Lease AK Hale, LLC to Ross Spokane, LLC dba SIA XN Air In January 2012, Ross Spokane acquired the Hales' FBO business, however, the Hales retained the agreement for the maintenance and avionics facility and assigned the agreement to AK Hale, LLC. AK Hale, LLC has requested the lease agreement be assigned to Ross Spokane who will assume the agreement under the same terms and conditions. Ross Spokane further agrees to assume the sublease agreement between AK Hale, LLC and Aircraft Solutions which expires on December 31, 2016. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- 8. ***First Amendment to Landside Snow Removal Services Contract** *Wm. Winkler Company* SIA This amendment exercises the first of four options with Wm. Winkler Co. to provide landside snow removal services commencing November 1, 2013 through April 1, 2014 at all parking lots, parking garage entrances and exits, the rental car ready/return lot and common use roadways in the Quick Turnaround Facility. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- 9. ***Operating Agreement for Aviation Related Activities** *Aircraft Solutions, LLC* Aircraft FF Solutions has requested an operating agreement for Felts Field in order to provide service for their customers. This agreement is effective September 1, 2013 and the monthly fee is \$35. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval.
- *Award Construction Contract, Miscellaneous Maintenance Paving Project Inland Asphalt Company This project will provide crack sealing, fog sealing and pavement repair at multiple locations at Felts Field and at Spokane International Airport outside of the secure area. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a contract for construction to Inland Asphalt Company in the amount of \$251,018.36 including Washington state sales tax. Staff further requests authorization of \$25,000 of additional funds for construction contingencies for a total authorization of \$276,018.36.
- 11. *Award Construction Contract, Miscellaneous Maintenance Paving Airfield Project Inland SIA Asphalt Company This project will provide crack sealing, fog sealing and pavement repair inside the Spokane International Airport security fence. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a construction contract to Inland Asphalt Company in the amount of \$62,239.45 including Washington state sales tax. Staff further requests authorization of \$25,000 of additional funds for construction contingencies for a total authorization of \$87,239.45.

- 12. *Award Construction Contract, Terminal Airport Drive Overlay Project Shamrock Paving, Inc. This project will provide a pavement overlay from the Concourse A/B skybridge to the ground transportation lot. Two bids from the small works roster were received on September 10, 2013. The Engineering Committee recommends award a contract for construction to Shamrock Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$211,691.80 including Washington state sales tax. Staff further requests authorization of \$25,000 of additional funds for construction contingencies for a total authorization of \$236,691.80.
- 13. *Award Construction Contract for Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) Facility Project SIA Lydig Construction, Inc. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a contract to Lydig Construction including the base bid of \$7,318,037.83 and Alternate No. 1 at \$49,508.07 for a total amount of \$7,367,545.90. Staff further requests authorization of \$740,000 for construction contingency for a total project authorization of \$8,107,545.90 including Washington state sales tax. The funding source for the project is the FAA Airport Improvement Program, AIP 3-53-0072-51, with local matching funds.
- 14. *Modification No. 1 to Professional Services Agreement, Construction Management Services of Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) Facility – Integrus Architecture – The Engineering Committee recommends approval of Modification No. 1 to Integrus Architecture in the amount of \$537,540.92 for construction management services of the new ARFF facility. Staff further requests authorization of \$54,000 of contingency for modifications to the construction management contract for a total authorization of \$591,540.92.
- 15. *Award Construction Contract, FedEx Facility Trailer Parking Lot Wm. Winkler Company -. SIA This project will include site lighting, concrete paving and drainage improvements in the area where air cargo carriers currently park tractor trailers. Plans and specifications from DCI Engineers were distributed to paving contractors on the small works roster. On September 10, 2013, three bids were received. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a contract in the amount of \$147,832.00 including Washington state sales tax to Wm. Winkler Company. Staff requests additional authorization of project contingency funds in the amount of \$15,000 for a total project authorization of \$162,832.00.
- 16. ***Final Balancing Change Order (CO) No. 2, 2013 Sidewalk Improvements Project** *Wm.* SIA FF *Winkler Company* This change order includes additional concrete ramps, curb and gutter at multiple locations, and repair to the Felts Terminal entry. The Engineering Committee recommends ratification of Change Order No. 2 to Wm. Winkler's contract in the amount of \$29,294.91 for a revised final contract amount of \$221,124.33.
- 17. *Award Construction Contract, Main Terminal Roof Snow Restraints, Flashing Repairs and Catwalk Installation *ICON Corporation* This project will include the installation of snow restraints on the roof of the Main Terminal, repair of an area of damaged flashing on the A/B Security roof, and the addition of a catwalk to connect the roof of the Ground Transportation Center to the Main Terminal roof. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a contract for construction to ICON Corporation in the amount of \$121,744.00 including Washington state sales tax. Staff further requests authorization of \$12,000 of additional funds for construction contingencies for a total authorization of \$133,744.00
- 18. *Award of Service Contract for Elevator and Escalator Maintenance Services KONE SIA Corporation Two bids were received in response to the request to provide elevator and escalator maintenance services at Spokane International Airport. The Engineering Committee recommends award of a three-year contract with two additional one-year options to KONE Corporation for an annual contract amount not to exceed \$100,000.

- 19. *Award Service Contract Renewal, Glycol Recovery and Management Services 2013-2014 SIA *Inland Technologies International, Ltd.* The Engineering Committee recommends award of a service contract renewal to Inland Technologies International, Ltd. for the 2013-2014 season for an amount not to exceed \$375,000 to provide glycol recovery services and equipment.
- 20. ***Procurement of Advance Cyclone CY5500 Surface Cleaning Vehicle** *Nilfisk-Advance, Inc.* SIA The Engineering Committee recommends the purchase of one Nilfisk-Advance Cyclone CY5500 surface cleaning vehicle for the amount of \$124,175.62 which includes all specified options, freight and Washington state sales tax. This equipment is available for purchase through the Houston-Galveston Area Council, an intergovernmental cooperative purchasing venture, and was included in the approved 2013 capital improvement program budget.
- 21. ***Procurement of Airfield Deicing Products for 2013-2014 Winter Season** *Schoenberg Salt Co.* SIA *and LNT Solutions, Inc.* The Engineering Committee recommends approval to purchase solid and liquid deicing products on an as-needed basis for the 2013-2014 winter season from LNT Solutions and Schoenberg Salt Company.
- 22. *Procurement of A & B Concourse Seating Contract Design Associates, Inc. The Engineering SIA Committee recommends the purchase of 405 seats to be placed in the A and B Concourses at a cost of \$476,437.81 through the U.S. Communities Government Purchasing Alliance, a government purchasing cooperative. Contract Design Associates will coordinate the purchase, delivery and installation of the seats.
- 23. ***Procurement of New Parking Shuttle** *Schetky Northwest, Inc.* The Engineering Committee SIA recommends the purchase of one Aerotech shuttle in the amount of \$63,678.63 including all specified options, freight and Washington state sales tax. This vehicle will replace a 2005 Ford F-350 and was approved in the 2013 capital improvement program budget.
- 24. ***Renewal of Employee Medical and Dental Benefits** The Finance Committee and staff SIA FF recommend approval of the employee Group Health Medical and Washington Dental Service ABP benefits renewal in an anticipated amount of \$1,671,030.12.

- 25. Other Transaction Agreement (OTA) for Checked Baggage Recapitalization Screening SIA Program Construction *Transportation Security Administration* The Transportation Security Administration has identified the need to replace five Explosive Detection System (EDS) machines that screen baggage for Concourses A/B and C and is offering an OTA with 100% funding for the construction and construction management of the replacement of these units. The Engineering Committee recommends approval of the execution of the OTA by the Airport Chief Executive Officer for the amount of \$5,555,412.00.
- 26. **Approval of Revision to Insurance Requirements in Agreements and Contracts** Staff has been SIA FF working with Wells Fargo to update the standard insurance requirements utilized in leases and ABP contracts. The Finance Committee and staff recommend approval of the proposed revisions.
