Tentative Agenda for the March 26, 2020 Board Meeting - AMENDED

The Airport Board meeting will be held on Thursday, March 26, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. in the Boardroom located at Spokane International Airport, 9000 West Airport Drive, Suite 204, Spokane, Washington 99224.

Consent Agenda Items # (1 - 6)

1. *Award Professional Services Agreement – General Contractor/Construction Manager (GC/CM) Advisor Services for Terminal Renovation & Expansion Program - CBRE/Heery – Spokane International Airport. The Airport intends to use the General Contractor/Construction Manager (GC/CM) project delivery method in accordance with RCW 39.10 to deliver the Terminal Renovation & Expansion (TREX) Program. A competitive proposal process was initiated and firms responded with statements of qualification (SOQ). SOQs were reviewed and scored by the Airport's Selection Team and CBRE|Heery was determined to be the best-qualified firm. Major

program elements of the TREX project include a centralized Security Screening Checkpoint and Baggage Claim Hall, an Airside Connecting Corridor, and expansion of the C Concourse including additional Passenger Boarding Bridges. The scope of work under the initial Agreement includes preparation of the PRC Application, GC/CM procurement and contract documents; organization and oversight of the GC/CM evaluation, scoring, interview, and award. Future work will be added by amendment, and will include (but will not be limited to) design phase assistance in document reviews, estimate reconciliations, value engineering and constructability reviews; leading GC/CM kickoff and partnering sessions; and construction phase project management. GC/CM procurement will commence immediately upon approval of the use of the project delivery method by the PRC, followed by establishment of the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP). Construction is projected to be get underway in mid to late 2021. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend award of a Professional Services Agreement to CBRE|Heery for General Contractor/Construction Manager (GC/CM) Advisor Services for the Terminal Renovation & Expansion Program in the lump sum amount of \$50,064.00.

- 2. *Approve Amendment No. 2 to Professional Services Agreement New Infield Taxilane Project Morrison-Maierle, Inc. Felts Field. During the FAA 7460-1 Airspace Review, the proposed hangars were found to trigger a line-of-site (LOS) issue from the tower to the airfield movement area. In order to eliminate the LOS conflict, the hangars were shifted to maximize hangar heights. This required the proposed taxilane to be redesigned to accommodate the new hangar locations. Morrison-Maierle, Inc. provided a scope and fee for Amendment No. 1 in the lump sum amount of \$2,100.00 to update the revised construction documents with the new configuration of the taxilane. Amendment No. 2 provides for construction phase services including construction observation, shop drawing and submittal review, survey grade checks, pay application review, and other construction phase services. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend approval of Amendment No. 2 to the Professional Services Agreement with Morrison-Maierle, Inc. for the New Infield Taxilane Project in the not-to-exceed amount of \$11,831.50 for a total amended contract amount of \$62,731.50.
- *Accept Energy Services Proposal Terminal Windows & Roofing Upgrade, Phase 1B -3. Washington State Department of Enterprise Services - Spokane International Airport. In April 2019, the Board accepted an Energy Services Proposal for the project that authorized the DES Energy Program to enter into a construction contract and amend the professional services agreement with Ameresco on behalf of the Airport for the Scope of Work (SOW) identified in the ESP, and also authorized amendment to the Interagency Agreement with DES Energy Program for project management services associated with the SOW identified in the ESP. The project started in 2019 and will be completed by November 2020. The project is being constructed in two phases. Major work under Phase 1A, which is substantially complete, included all re-roofing, all North Skybridge work, B Concourse electrochromic (EC) glass, and Rotunda High Bay translucent panels. The cost of Phase 1A was \$5,849,226.00. Phase 1B will include A Concourse EC glass; parking garage 2nd level vestibule; Rotunda EC glass; A and B Concourse ramp translucent panels and door/window replacements; Ground Transportation Center EC glass and translucent panels; curbside EC glass and vestibules; and Security Screening Checkpoint translucent panels. The cost for Phase 1B is \$4,481,323.00. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend acceptance of the Energy Services Proposal and authorization for DES as described above for Phase 1B of the project in the amount of \$4,481,323.00.
- 4. *Approve Amendment No. 1 to Professional Services Agreement Rental Car Facility Quick Turnaround Area Building and Public Car Wash Improvements DCI Engineers, Inc. Spokane International Airport. In June 2019, the Board approved a Professional Services Agreement with DCI Engineers, Inc. for design of the Quick Turnaround Area Building and the Public Car Wash Improvements in the amount of \$216,641.00. Amendment No. 1 consists of construction management and administration (CM/CA) services for the construction phase of the project, including materials testing on a time and materials basis in the not-to-exceed amount of

\$81,510.40. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend approval of Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services Agreement with DCI Engineers, Inc. in the not-to-exceed amount of \$81,510.40 for CM/CA services and total project authorization in the amount of \$298,151.40 for the Rental Car Facility - Quick Turnaround Area Building and Public Car Wash Improvements.

- 5. * Approve Procurement Traffic Marking Paint and Reflective Glass Bead Products Spokane International Airport, Airport Business Park, and Felts Field. This procurement will authorize purchase of paint and associated products for runways, taxiways, and roadways during the 2020 calendar year on an as-needed basis. These materials will be purchased through State of Washington Contract Nos. 02817 and 02513. Road and airfield paint material purchases in 2019 totaled \$88,127.70 and are projected to cost approximately \$105,000.00 in 2020. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend approval to procure Traffic Marking Paint and Reflective Glass Bead products through State of Washington Contract Nos. 02817 and 02513 on an as-needed basis in the not-to-exceed amount of \$105,000.00 including Washington States Sales Tax for the 2020 calendar year.
- 6. *Approve Procurement Herbicides and Pesticides Spokane International Airport, Airport Business Park, Felts Field. This procurement will authorize purchase of herbicide and pesticide products for maintaining the grounds during the 2020 calendar year on an as-needed basis. These materials will be purchased through State of Washington Contract No. 02917. Herbicide purchases in 2019 totaled \$79,254.83 including Washington State Sales Tax and are projected to cost approximately \$110,000.00 in 2020. The Engineering Committee and Staff recommend approval to procure airfield and landside herbicide and pesticide products through State of Washington Contract No. 02917 on an as-needed basis in the not-to-exceed amount of \$110,000.00 including Washington State Sales Tax for the 2020 calendar year.
